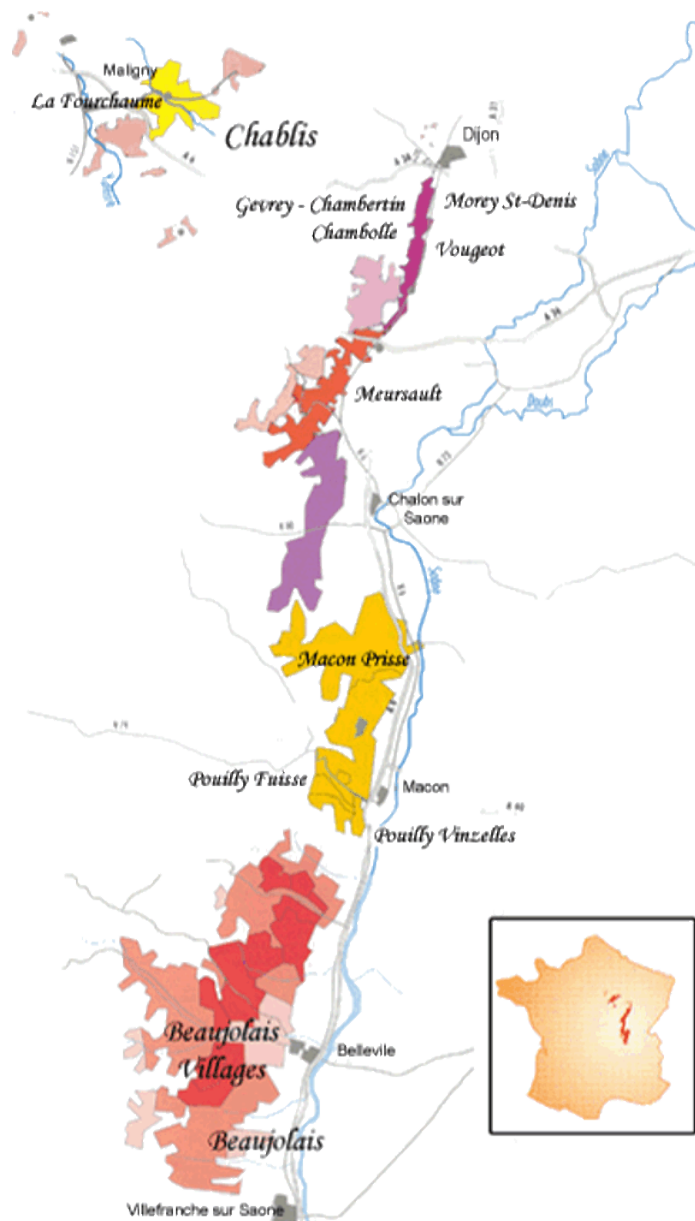

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# WHITE WINES

## BURGUNDY



Say Burgundy and most people think of the famous wines of the Côte de Nuits and Côte de Beaune, but Burgundy stretches from Chablis in the North (close to the Aube vineyards of Champagne) down to Beaujolais in the South (close to the Rhone Valley).

Burgundy still produces the world's greatest Chardonnay and Pinot Noir wines and the only Gamay wines ever to achieve classic status. However it has been debased in recent years by a growing number of lacklustre wines that rely solely on the reputation of the famous Burgundian names, which their producers choose to sell low quality wines at high prices. Therefore 'caveat emptor' applies, buyers would be best advised to seek out the genuinely talented and skilled winemakers such as Etienne Sauzet, Francois Mestre of Michelot, Roger Luquet, Pierre Morey of Domaine Leflaive and Philippe Testut in Chablis.

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## WHITE BURGUNDY

- 100 Bourgogne Chardonnay 2011, Etienne Sauzet £65.00**  
Gerald Boudet, son in law to the late Etienne Sauzet, is the one of the star wine makers of Burgundy. This small 8 hectare estate produced wines of great definition and style. 10 months ageing on it's lees has given this wine delicate complexity.
- 101 Bourgogne Chardonnay 2008, Domaine Michelot £62.50**  
Situated on the edge of the village of Meursault, this domaine is now run by Bernard Michelot's son in law, François Mestre. He has brought a more refined style to complement the traditional rich butteriness of previous years. This wine has a superb, tight acidity giving a razor sharp freshness that will delight.

### Côte Chalonnaise

- 102 Rully 1er Cru 'Les Margotes' 2014, Domaine Jean-Claude Brelière £72.50**  
Undoubtedly the finest grower in this appellation - this small 7ha domaine produces excellent fruit. While the wine is fermented in oak, only 10% is new. A superb steely structure holds together a lovely array of ripe fruit aromas. Unfiltered to maintain the fantastic depth of flavours.

### The Maconnais

- 103 Mâcon La Roche Vineuse 2013, Olivier Merlin £45.00**  
Olivier Merlin is one of the rising stars of Macon, set just north of the village of Fuissé in La Roche Vineuse, his vineyards are ideally sited to produce classic Chardonnay - rich and full flavoured.
- 104 St. Véran 2017, Vers le Mont, Domaine Roger Luquet £48.00**  
Classic unoaked Chardonnay from an excellent vintage.
- 105 Pouilly Fuissé Vieilles Vignes 2006, Château Fuissé £120.00**  
This is a rich, complex Chardonnay, whose structure and underlying lemony fruit belies its Maconnais origin. Full bodied with rich oaky texture

## WHITE BURGUNDY

### Côte de Beaune

- 107 Meursault 2014, Domaine Bernard Michelot** **£95.00**  
Jean-Michel Mestre, the son-in-law of Bernard Michelot assumed control of this Domaine in 1993 and has slowly built a reputation as one of Meursault's best growers, no mean feat in a small village packed with winemaking talent. This wine has nutty, toasty oak adding the depth and richness to the citrus, apple and melon fruit. Finely balanced between opulent richness and purity of fruit, it has a long life ahead of it.
- 108 St. Aubin 1er Cru 2007, Clos du Meix, Domaine Hubert Lamy** **£95.00**  
Not the sexiest of names, but this domaine is producing outstanding wines that better many Meursault from more renowned growers. This '07 is now drinking beautifully - rich and flavoursome.
- 109 Meursault 1er Cru 2006 Les Bouchères, Domaine Pierre Morey** **£220.00**  
Pierre Morey is the winemaker at the world famous Domaine Leflaive, and this wine is from his private domaine. Beautifully crafted, with great depth and concentration.
- 110 Puligny Montrachet 2015 ' Les Houlières' Domaine Machard de Gramont** **£110.00**  
This is a great value wine from one of Burgundy's best vintages - full bodied, fine and steely.
- 111 Puligny Montrachet 2008 1er Cru les Perrières Domaine Etienne Sauzet** **£220.00**  
Gerard Boudet, son in law of the late Etienne Sauzet, is one of the star wine makers of this appellation. This small 8 hectare domaine produces wines of great definition and style. The wines are left on their lees for ten months, this and a careful use of new oak, delivers a wine of great elegance.

### Chablis

- 112 Montagny Les Basset 2016, Chateau de Chamilly** **£65.00**  
Each of Chateau de Chamilly's wines has its own identity. At vineyards located at a 17<sup>th</sup> century estate at Côte Chalonaise, Chamilly aim to celebrate to these differences. Fruity, refreshing and uncomplicated on the palette, the wines offer the minerality of Chassagne alongside the yellow stone fruit notes of Puligny. Perfect for serving with food or enjoyed alone, it is a decidedly fresh and balanced wine.
- 113 Chablis 2017, Domaine Testut** **£55.00**  
Domaine Testut is considered to be one of the truly great winemaking domaines of the region, and their wines are de rigueur in all French Michelin Star restaurants. Pure Chardonnay fruit balanced by mineral acidity - a classic wine.
- 114 Chablis 1er Cru 'Montmains' 2015, Domaine des Marronniers** **£65.00**  
Produced from vineyards located on Kimmerdgian soils formed millions of years ago. Intense, rich grapefruit character with a delicious pure, light balancing acidity.
- 115 Chablis Grand Cru 'Grenouille' 2012, Domaine Philippe Testut** **£118.00**  
A magnificent wine from a master producer. Richly complex with a long, satisfying, yet elegant, racy and aromatic style.

Juniper's talented winemaker Mark Messenger crafts this wine using parcels of estate-grown fruit as well as that sourced from friends and neighbours in and around Margaret River's Wilyabrup region. Such 'Crossing' gives rise to extra depth and complexity. Heady Western Australian Chardonnay, a riot of lemony, tropical fruit flavours with excellent length.

A delightful balance of tropical fruits and lemon, creamy with hints of French oak and a lovely tangy finish.
- 142 Pinot Gris, Domain Road 2017, New Zealand** **£50.00**  
Central Otago's Domain Road Vineyard, near Bannockburn, is sited in a sheltered valley which provides a unique micro-climate ideal for producing premium wines. The fruit has been whole bunch pressed and fermented to retain a hint of sweetness in an off-dry style. Pears and stone fruit dominate the bouquet, together with hints of quince. The sweet taste of pears and peaches comes through on the palate. This medium bodied wine has a good texture and fine balance.

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## ROSE WINES

- 200 Bolney Rosé 2016, Bolney Wine Estate (England) £52.00**  
Bolney Wine Estate is one of the longest established English vineyards and has been making award-winning English wines at its Sussex estate for over 35 years. The sandstone soils are some of the best in the country, providing the ideal setting to grow vines. The Bolney Wine Estate is a haven for wildlife, and through its traditional production methods and cultural practices, avidly promotes and maintains soil health, fertility and stability in its vineyards. A beautiful medium-dry rosé full of lychée and apple flavours
- 201 Pinot Grigio Rosé 2016 Amori, Piedmont, Italy £32.00**  
The skins of the Pinot Grigio grape acquire a lovely rose hue in the warm autumnal sunshine. Coppery pink with an overtly delicious and refreshing tang.
- 202 Bush Vine Blush, Richelieu, IGP Pays du Gers, France £28.50**  
This delicious Rosé is produced from hand harvested grapes in the heart of Gascogne. Rich soft fruit flavours are perfectly balanced by crisp acidity. Gold Medal winner at the Paris Wine Fair.
- 203 White Zinfandel 2016, Angel's Flight, California, USA £33.00**  
Named after the Los Angeles Incline Railway, this Rose is deliciously fruity, redolent of soft ripe summer fruits with a lovely honeyed finish that lingers long on the palate.



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# RED WINES

## BORDEAUX



Bordeaux is an area of almost perfect viticultural situation on the west coast of France and benefits from the ultimate marketing tool – a châteaux based classification system, that was invented almost 150 years ago. Bordeaux is the largest source of quality wine in the world, with 7000 châteaux and domaines, producing over 44 million cases of wine a year.

Recent developments in Bordeaux have had a major impact on wine selection in three ways:-

1. During the 1980's, 'Second wines' of the finest estates became fashionable because they offer an insight to the delights of the main wines at a fraction of their cost. We have featured a number of such wines in our list.
2. Green harvesting is a process of culling immature bunches of grapes in mid season, thereby allowing the remaining bunches to flourish and produce a higher quality crop.
3. From 1994 estates began to pick grapes at harvest on the basis of tannin ripeness, as well as sugar content etc. Unfortunately unripe tannins never hydorrise (absorb into the wine) and not only affect the pleasure of the taste, but take years to fall out of the wine, as sediment. So this change has produced forward drinking wines whose fruit, and not tannin, dominates the taste.

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In this instance we will endeavour to offer a suitable alternative.*

**RED WINES****BORDEAUX****St. Emilion**

- 300 Château Moulin de Mallet 2015, St Emilion** **£33.50**  
This super little château situated on the plateau of Pujol, a rocky outcrop overlooking the Dordogne and facing the slopes of St Emilion. Owned and run by Serge Couderc and his son Julien who manage the estate, following “lutte raisonnée” principles, they always look to take low yields hence the intensity of concentrated fruits.
- 301 Château Corbin 2015, Montagne/St Emilion** **£47.50**  
One of the oldest properties in Montagne, this château produces a stunningly fruity wine from 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Sauvignon.
- 302 Château Jean Fagouet 2012, Grand Cru St Emilion** **£60.00**  
The Chateau Jean Voisin “Fagouet” is a Merlot-based cuvee that includes a significant dollop of Cab Franc. Crafted by Pierre Chassagnoux’s granddaughter, Laurence, it is the delicious result of great attention to the grapevines and tender, loving care in the cellar — practices that have been in place now for nearly 60 years.
- 303 Château Capet Duverger 2012, Grand Cru St Emilion** **£72.00**  
Owned by Michel Duverger, former longstanding president of the co-op, who had been the driving force to improve the overall quality of the Château estates belonging to the Union, Château Capet Duverger is one of the examples of this success story with its classic Saint Emilion Grand Cru style. This wine has good, ripe structure with mouth-filling spicy fruit and fine length. Lovely plummy fruit is backed by fine tannins making for a deliciously juicy wine.
- 304 Château Clocher 2009, Pomerol** **£125.00**  
Wine writer Tom Stevenson believes this is one of the most undervalued Pomerols. Aged in new and one year old casks, this wine is medium to full bodied with bags of plump, ripe fruit, a supple structure, intriguing vanilla undertones, and plenty of finesse.

**Médoc**

- 305 Château Tour St. Bonnet 2005 Cru Bourgeois** **£75.00**  
Plantings are 45% Merlot, 45% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Petit Verdot and 5% Malbec with an average age of 35 years. Jacques Merlet, the estate manager prefers to age the wines for 18 months in large oak foudres. A perennial favourite, the 2005 is quite plump on the palate and has gobs of chewy red fruit and very smooth tannins. This wine is absolutely delicious!

**RED WINES****BORDEAUX** (CONTD):**Margaux****307 Château d'Angludet 2011 £91.50**

Owned by Peter Sichel of the star performing Château Palmer. It is matured in wood for 12 months with up to 1/3 new oak. Medium to full bodied with excellent fruit, finesse and finish. Classic Margaux.

**306 Alter Ego Château Palmer 2000 £290.00**

From the colour, the vintage divulges its secrets: garnet-coloured with a deep garnet edge. As the curtain opens, a rich aromatic palate seduces: beginning with jammy, black fruits followed closely by spices, bright tobacco, leather, mocha, moss and subtle traces of truffle. An explosion of perfectly ripe fruit supported by a silky set of tannins and lovely freshness.

**St. Estèphe****377 Château Cos d'Estournel 1985, 2ème Cru (Limited Stock) £415.00**

Across the street from Medoc giant Lafite-Rothschild, Chateau Cos d'Estournel stands up well to its famous neighbour. The winery dates back to 1810, when Louis Gaspard d'Estournel christened the site and began producing wine. He expanded his business as far as India and became known as 'The Maharaja of St. Estephe'. Eventually, however, debt would catch up to him and he would have to sell his property. Through the ages the vineyard has passed through numerous hands, now belonging to Michel Reybier. 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot aged in 100% new oak

At the peak of its power now, with The Wine Advocate rating the wine 93/100 upon release saying: "Fabulously scented bouquet of concentrated red cherries and black fruit (especially black cherries). It is rich and lush, long and medium to full bodied".

**378 Château Montrose 1982, 2ème Cru (Limited Stock) £525.00**

Chateau Montrose is one of the leading wine properties of St. Estephe, and produces some of the longest-lived wines in the Medoc. Montrose had been owned by Jean-Louis Charmolue from 1962 until 2006, when it was sold to Martin and Olivier Bouygues, owner of the eponymously named construction firm Bouygues, is located in the east of the appellation, just north of the hamlet of Marbuzet, on a gravel knoll only 800 metres from the Gironde estuary. The proximity of the estuary ensures a microclimate that protects against frost, and the vines, which lie on deep clay-gravel soils, benefit from a south-easterly aspect. 65% Cabernet Sauvignon 25% Merlot 10% Cabernet Franc matured in oak barriques (30% new) for 18 months.

Intense aromas of kirsch, currant and spice follow through to a full-bodied palate, with round, velvety tannins and a long, long finish. This is complex, changing on the nose and palate. Layered and structured. Will still improve for many years to come.
